(Blacksburg, VA) – VT KnowledgeWorks proudly announces member company TORC Technologies' (TORC) partnership with Virginia Tech to enter Team Victor Tango as one of eleven selected finalists to compete in the DARPA Urban Challenge, on November 3, 2007. The challenge, inspired from a congressional mandate to keep one-third of ground combat vehicles remote controlled and unmanned, takes place within a six hour time limit on a 60 mile off-road track in Victorville, California.

TORC uses software based on SAE AS-4 JAUS (Joint Architecture for Unmanned Systems) standard to propel Odin, its autonomous vehicle. JAUS is a component-based message-passing architecture that specifies data formats and methods of communication among computing nodes. TORC has commercialized several cutting-edge products defined by JAUS standard for the Urban Challenge, including SafeStopTM Wireless Emergency Stop System, ByWireTM Drive-by-Wire Conversion Module, AutonoNavTM Autonomous Navigation System, and InterOpTM Collaborative Online JAUS Integration Environment.

Michael Fleming, CEO of TORC Technologies, stated "This competition has driven teams to create and demonstrate new autonomous technologies in a competitive environment. Technologies that are proven successful in the DARPA Urban Challenge must find their way into other DoD programs. To facilitate this transition, it is important that standards such as JAUS are adopted."
